

JUDGING CRITERIA FOR THE SCOUT EXPO

1. **ATTITUDE:** Are participants courteous and cooperative with others?

Is there interaction between exhibitors and attendees?

2. **ATTENDANCE:** Was the booth attended at all times? There should be at least two members and two adults at the booth at all times. (Adults can be sitting along store front walls across from their booth) Safety precautions are demonstrated in all activities.

3. **PERSONAL APPEARANCE:** All participants are in proper uniform or costume? Are all neat and clean?

4. **SUBJECT KNOWLEDGE:** Scouts should be able to converse with spectators and answer questions about the subject matter and how the exhibit was prepared.

5. **EXHIBIT APPEARANCE:** The exhibit should be attractive and well planned to catch spectators' attention and be easily understood. It should reflect planning and preparation by youth members.

6. **SUBJECT MATTER:** Is this a satisfactory presentation or demonstration of the subject? Does it merit a look by the public? Is it educational or informative? Would it interest spectators enough to find out more about Scouting programs?

7. **LIVE ACTION:** Is this a "live" exhibit? A booth where the family or youth get involved or attracts their curiosity?

8. **DISPLAY IDENTIFICATION:** Is there a legible sign giving the unit number, charter organization and subject of the booth?

While all units at the Expo compete against these same standards, the important thing is to DO YOUR BEST. Let's give folks the best show possible! If we do our best, WE ARE WINNERS, regardless of our score in relation to others. Set out to do the best you can and congratulate all those who helped make your booth great! Make sure your members are IN THE SPOTLIGHT AT THE SCOUT EXPO!
